She was awarded the Order of the Rising Sun, Gold Rays with Neck Ribbon (= Kyokujitsu chujusho) by the Japanese Government in recognition of her significant contribution to deepening and developing Japanese Studies and promoting mutual understanding between Japan and the United Kingdom in April 2014.
