## Shareholder Activism in Japan and the Role of Independent Directors

「日本における株主アクティビズムと独立取締役」

Keynote speaker Prof. Jeffrey Gordon (Columbia University) will raise the issue of institutionalization (change from widely dispersed stock ownership to concentrated ownership by a few institutional investors) and the change this has wrought to the role of independent directors in the U.S. Then, Prof. Wataru Tanaka (Tokyo University) and Prof. Zenichi Shishido (Hitotsubashi University) will describe the current situation in Japan where similar phenomena are occurring. The presentations will be followed by a panel discussion of the current problems and future possibilities of corporate governance in the U.S. and Japan.
