
By doing away with paper, we can save cost as well as using time efficiently.

Day 1

Through the first 1.5 hours, students make their plans covering whole 2 weeks.

Students study for 3 hours following their own plans. There is a 15 minutes break.

Feel free to ask questions

Whenever students have questions, they can ask to teachers. 5 high school students have 1 teacher, so high school students can ask questions without waiting for long.

Day 2 ~

After studying for 1.5 hours, high school students have a 15 minutes break. Teachers have time to do what they plan through the break. For example, teachers talk about how they studied when they were high school students.

Extending the break to 30 minutes, we have events in which high school students get friends.



E Giving Feedback



Team MTG

Teachers facilitate the discussions among students how well each high school students did or how each of them study. It will help high school students to acquire the knowledge of studying and get accustomed to studying.

Discussing topic such as how to study is difficult and there are many answers. Teachers provide their own answer to those topic, so that high school students can get another perspective on the topic.









Building	We hold the program in high schools, so that we do not have costs of holding buildings.			
Textbooks	In our program, high schools students use their own textbooks, so we do not provide textbooks.			
Wages	We do not pay for professional teachers, which cram schools pay a lot.			
Advertising	We do not advertise on TV or other media, which cost a lot.

Wages for university students = Wages per hour (2,000 yen) × 8 hours × 10 days × 4 people × n sessions

Business development = 7 million yen (the average annual wages for business development person) \times 70% (the average wages of retired people) \times m (people)

Interns = 1,000 yen (Wages per hour) × 8 hours × 275 days ×x (people) Website = 206,000 yen


