If You Are on Treatment

If you are currently undergoing treatment, we **strongly recommend** that you bring a sufficient amount of medication for the duration of your stay.

Please note that you may have to wait several weeks, in particular at a psychiatry department that can offer treatment in a foreign language, and even if the medicine has the same ingredients, it may not be possible to get the same dosage in Japan.

We also **strongly recommend** that you bring a letter of referral (summary of current medical history) from your physician written in English or Japanese. Without an adequate letter, it is extremely difficult to see a doctor in Japan. It is also difficult for Hitotsubashi University health center to refer a hospital.

Bringing Your Medication

You may be able to bring it with you to Japan if you follow certain procedures prior to your departure. Some medicine **CANNOT** be brought into Japan. Please check prior to departure. If you are unable to bring your regular medication, please consult your physician as soon as possible and consider changing to another drug which can be brought into Japan.
