Job Description	The Graduate School of Economics at Hitotsubashi University invites applications for a tenured associate professor position or a full professor position, starting on April 1 or September 1, 2025. The start date of the appointment is negotiable. We are interested in candidates with research interests in the fields of applied microeconomics, especially international economics. The rank of the selected candidate will depend upon the candidate's qualifications. The successful candidate will teach mainly applied microeconomics courses (especially international economics) for graduate students and for undergraduate students via seminars and lectures. A tenured successful candidate is expected to teach 3 classes (6 credits) in addition to undergraduate and graduate seminars. Note that each class meets 13 times (105 minutes each) twice a week during an academic quarter. Administrative duties include shared responsibility for committee membership and entrance examinations.
Qualifications (required skills, experiences, etc.)	Requirements for the position: (1) Ph.D. in relevant fields (2) Fluent communication skills and teaching skills in English (3) Candidate must have ability to advise students in Japanese or English and to perform administrative tasks (such as producing documents and participating in meetings) in Japanese.
Work Hours	- Workhours are deemed as 7 hours and 45 minutes per weekday / 38 hours and 45 minutes per week, in accordance with the Discretionary Work System for Professional Work. - Work days are 5 days a week, Monday through Friday.
Days off	Saturdays and Sundays, national holidays, year-end and New Year days off; Other days as designated by the president of the university.
