Program Features

At the beginning of the twenty-first century, when there was a move towards closer economic integration in the EU nations, their leaders found themselves standing at a crossroads.

The financial crises that occurred in Greece, Spain, Italy, and Cyprus have generated serious, wide-ranging discussions over the nature of appropriate EU governance.

A clear understanding of the present situation of the EU economy and a close analysis of the structure of the EU governance are the two pillars on which we will rest in order to eliminate the potential threat of another financial crisis, and thus, these pillars will be urgently necessary for the health of Japanese economy, too.

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Launched in the 2013 Academic Year, this program aims at rearing global economic leaders of the next generation by providing for both undergraduate and post-graduate students a series of lectures focusing on the examination of the industry, finance, and governance in the EU. The purpose of this program is to offer students a series of lectures from which they can acquire profound knowledge of financial and economic activities of the EU nations and academic abilities to analyze the governance of the EU. In this age of increasing acceleration of economic globalization, knowing what the EU experienced during the recent crises could give us answers to the urgent questions that the Japanese economy is facing. It is a great pleasure to establish a unique research program entitled "The Governance and Economy Management in the European Union" in our university and be able to enrich our education of future global leaders by offering special lectures, summer programs, and other related projects.

It is our hope that this program will interest not only the students of the Faculty of Economics, but also students from other faculties, and help them deepen their understanding of the changing socio-economic climate of the EU and its relation to the global economy.

Finally, this program is supported by The Training Program of the EU Economy Analysts, another educational program subsidized by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan, and is open to students who are enrolled in universities that participate in EUIJ (EU Institute in Japan) and EUSI (EU Studies Institute).
