



Title of the Activity:	Open Lecture "The EU in the world and EU-Japan Relations"				
Purpose of the Activity:	As part of continuing lectures connected to Professor Takako Ueta's "International History" course.				
Description/Program:	Anne Barrington, Ambassador of Ireland to Japan, delivered a lecture at ICU. On her topic of "Ireland and the Brexit Problem." Touching on the history of Ireland's independence and its relations with the U.K., she gave an overview of what was happening in Ireland today and explained the impact of the U.K.'s decision to leave the E.U., which was already beginning to emerge in the two countries, and about concerns surrounding the issue for the future. Ambassador Barrington also talked about the attitude of the Irish people toward the integration of Europe, which is different from the public opinion in the U.K., and pointed to the importance of the E.U. for Ireland, also referring to the future of European integration.

Irish Ambassador to Japan HE Anne Barrington gives a lecture

Update: October 31, 2017



Her Excellency Anne Barrington, Ambassador of Ireland to Japan, visited ICU on Tuesday, Oct. 31, and gave a special open lecture (in English) on "Ireland and the Brexit Problem." The lecture was given as part of the class on International History by Professor Takako Ueta (Major: International Relations, Politics; former Ambassador, Deputy Chief of the Mission of Japan to the E.U.).

Touching on the history of Ireland's independence and its relations with the U.K., she gave an overview of what was happening in Ireland today and explained the impact of the U.K.'s decision to leave the E.U., which was already beginning to emerge in the two countries, and about concerns surrounding the issue for the future. Ambassador Barrington also talked about the attitude of the Irish people toward the integration of Europe, which is different from the public opinion in the U.K., and pointed to the importance of the E.U. for Ireland, also referring to the future of European integration.

Some participants asked questions about the differences in public perception of national identity and European identity in the U.K. and Ireland, Catalonia's attempt at independence from Spain, the past terrorism in Northern Ireland as well as about immigration to Ireland. The ambassador gave responses to their questions attentively.
